b	The course shall be IR modular course in accordance with Appendix 6 to CAR FCL.		
С	The course shall comprise:		
	- Theoretical knowledge instruction to the IR knowledge level;		
	- Instrument flight instruction.		
d	Theoretical Knowledge - IR modular training course. An approved modular IR course shall comprise at least 150 hours of theoretical knowledge instruction		
е	Theoretical Knowledge Examination. Applicants shall demonstrate a level of theoretical knowledge		
	appropriate to the privileges granted in the following subjects: Air Law, Aircraft General Knowledge -		
	Instrumentation, Flight Planning and Monitoring, Human Performance, Meteorology, Radio Navigation, IFR Communications.
